TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEE

Cal State East Bay's Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program is designed to assist students with baccalaureate degree objectives who plan to begin their college education at a community college before entering the University.

The TAG agreement outlines the community college coursework necessary to guarantee later entry into Cal State East Bay. Combined with early advising prior to submitting an application for admission, the program helps to ensure the completion of required and recommended coursework for admission, general education completion, and lower-division major requirements. A dual admission component to the TAG program allows participants to obtain a Cal State East Bay photo identification card, permitting access to the university library and other facilities.

TAG agreements must be completed no later than one year prior to intended entry into Cal State East Bay. Once a TAG agreement is completed, students are ready to apply and be admitted to Cal State East Bay for a pre-selected term of entry.

TAG Guidelines

Students are eligible to participate in the TAG program if they have completed a minimum of 12 units at another university or community college, are a California resident, are a first-time undergraduate student, and if they will have earned a cumulative GPA of 2.0 with at least 60 semester or 90 quarter transferable units by the time they transfer. Students must also be in good standing at the time of transfer, and must have completed transferable G.E. courses in English composition, speech, critical thinking, and mathematics with a grade of C or better. Although not a requirement of the program, students who have decided on a major are encouraged to complete the lower-division requirements while attending the community college.

TAG is not available for students on visas, second bachelor's degree or impacted program applicants, and students with coursework from other countries.

Students who do not transfer within 4 years, or those who transfer before the completion of 60 semester or 90 quarter units, lose their TAG status.

TAG Procedures

STUDENT

- Initiates TAG with either their community college or CSUEB counselor
- Reviews and signs TAG form
- Meets with Cal State East Bay counselor to submit form
- Takes signed copy of form to University Library on the Hayward Campus or the Academic Services Lobby on the Concord campus to obtain a CSUEB photo identification card (must also present a government-issued identification card)
- Submits CSU Application for Admission during appropriate filing period

COMMUNITY COLLEGE COUNSELOR

- Reviews document with student
- Indicates approval by signing form
- Submits form to Cal State East Bay counselor
- Maintains a copy of the TAG

CAL STATE EAST BAY COUNSELOR

- Meets with student prior to transfer to review form
- Signs form or returns form for corrections
- Returns appropriate TAG form copies to the community college and the student
- Meets with student prior to transfer
