Written Homework:

Homework assignments from the text can be found on the Unit Checklists. Homework is due on exam days. See the Homework Grading Policy document for instructions. All work must be shown.

Online Homework and Quizzes:

Online homework can be found by clicking the “Online Homework” button on CourseCompass. Online quizzes can be found by clicking the “Online Quiz” button. All homework and quizzes have posted deadlines. You may redo the homework and quizzes an unlimited number of times. Your lowest online homework score and quiz will be dropped. Discussion board assignments can be found on the Discussion Board link and will count as part of the online work. Do not wait until the deadline to submit online assignments. You will not get extensions if you do not submit on time.

Extra Credit:

For competing the online homework or quiz early you will receive extra credit points. One point for each assignment completed 24 hours early. The work must have a score of 100% and the maximum overall percentage of online work will not exceed 105%.

Exams:

- There will be 2 written exams
- The first exam will cover chapters 4–6 and the second exam will cover chapters 7–9
- To receive a grade of C or better you must have 70% average on the exams
- Exams will be in room 7310 from 2:00 – 4:00 on July 16 and August 6
- No make-up exams will be given; if you miss an exam you will receive a score of zero.
- A valid photo ID is required for each written exam (Drivers license, passport, or school id)
- All exams are closed book and calculators are permitted
- You are permitted an optional 2% note card. What this means is you may fill out (front and back) a 3×5 note card with anything you want. At the start of the exam, place your card on my desk. Anytime during the exam you may come get it and 2% will be deducted from your score
- To get your exam back, you can provide me a self addressed, stamped envelope
