Physical Site

- Located in San Bruno on an 111-acre campus
- Established in 1969 as part of the San Mateo County Community College District
- Campus includes 7 major buildings, 42 lecture classrooms, 35 lab classrooms, 9 computer labs, 520 seat theater, and art gallery
- Student and Community Center & The Science Annex opened in January 2007
- The "One Stop" Student Services Center opened in Fall 2001
- The Learning Resources building houses a 50,000 volume library, The Learning Center, and electronic classrooms

Curriculum

- 44 Associate Degree programs
- 43 Certificate programs
- Honors Transfer Program
- Interdisciplinary Studies major
- Learning Communities (i.e. ASTEP, Kababayan, MESA, Puente, Women in Transition)

Student Population

- Approximately 9,449 students take 1,009 class sections
- Generally, three-quarters of the students are part-time and one-quarter are full-time students
- Approximately 39% are day students, 39% are evening students & 22% are day/evening combination
