
# PROMISE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The Promise Scholars Program first lauched at Skyline College, has seen clear success with its first two cohorts of 140 and 253 students respectively. Beginning in Fall 2018, the Promise Scholars Program expanded across SMCCCD to replicate the ASAP model, implementing the key components of the CUNY program and expanding to serve up to 2,000 students in the Fall 2018 and Fall 2019 cohorts which are the focus of the data below.


## PROMISE SCHOLAR METRICS

#### FIRST GENERATION STATUS


(Fall 2019 Cohort)

The SMCCCD Promise Scholars Program served 1,319 students who demonstrated an 80% fall '18 - fall '19 persistence rate - which is higher than the 72% fall-to-fall persistence rate of the full-time comparison group.

\*Full-time comparison group: New degree, transfer and/or certificate seeking full-time students who are not Promise Scholars.
