



The Promise Scholars Program at Skyline College has seen clear success with its first two cohorts of 140 and 253 students respectively and the data below focuses on these initial groups. Beginning in Fall 2018, the Promise Scholars Program reached full replication of the ASAP model, implementing all of the key components of the CUNY program and expanding to serve over 750 students in the Fall 2018 and Fall 2019 cohort.

## FALL 2018 - FALL 2019 PERSISTENCE RATE\*



The Promise Scholars Program served 507 students who demonstrated an 83% fall '18 - fall '19 persistence rate significantly higher than the 72% persistence rate of the full-time comparison group.\*\*
