The **Promise Scholars Program** at **Cañada College** provides financial, academic and personalized student services including dedicated counseling and transportation assistance for first-time college students who enroll at Cañada College full-time to earn a certificate or degree. The program is based on the ASAP model developed by the City University of New York which has doubled graduation rates. Since the first cohort in 2018, the Promise Scholars Program has been expanded to serve up to 500 students annually.





FALL 2018 COHORT - 2 YEAR COMPLETION RATE*




The Fall 2018 PSP cohort served 330 students. Within two years, 15% of students completed their educational goal of earning a Associate degree, Certificate, or Transfer. Of these students 8%, specifically, earned an Associate degree which is higher than the historical two-year degree completion rate of 6.2%**
